- 3. Training and Capacity Building- Train healthcare workers, educators, and community leaders on HIV/AIDS to serve as program ambassadors. Provide ongoing professional development to keep up with the latest advancements and best practices.
- 4. Community Engagement- Involve community leaders and influencers to endorse and participate in the program. Organize community events, such as health fairs and awareness walks, to foster a sense of collective responsibility.
- 5. Monitoring and Evaluation- Establish metrics to assess program effectiveness, such as the number of people tested changes in knowledge and attitudes, and reduction in stigma. Use feedback to continuously improve program components and delivery methods.
