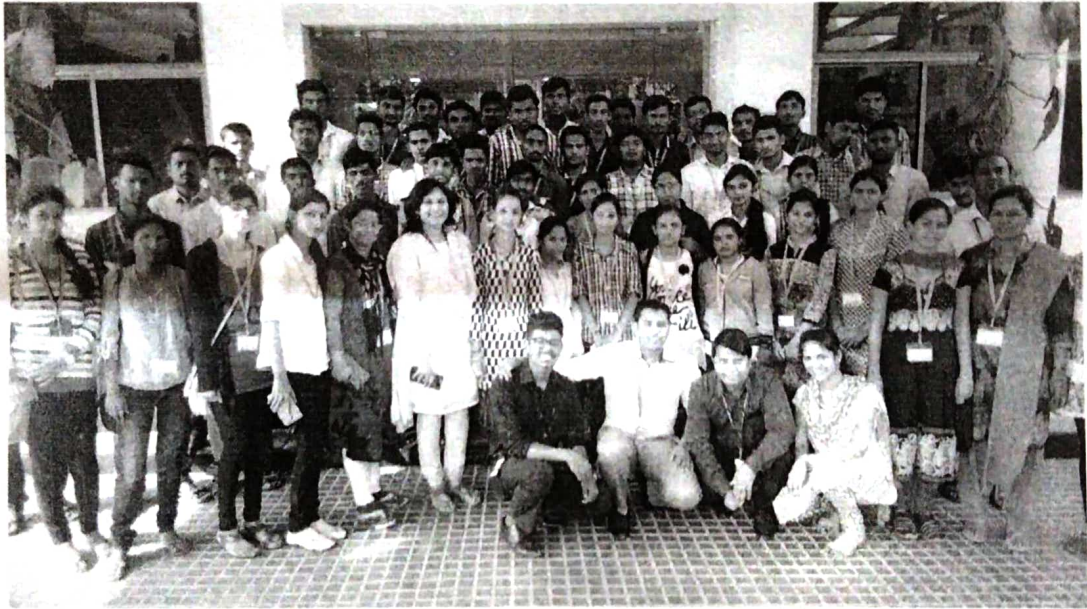

The Department of M.Sc Computer Science and BCA has organized an Academic Study Tour to visit TCS Software Company at Bangalore and then visit to Mysore, Madikeri Dharmastal, Udapi and Murudeshwar.

The journey began at 9.00 pm from the College premises on 03/02/2016. The private bus with 49 students and 06 faculty members were excited for the visit of the TCS Company and other tourist places around the Bangalore and Mysore.

Visit to Murudeshwar

Murudeshwar was reached at 6.00 in the morning. After having breakfast the entire team set out for the visit. First it begins with the Murudeshwar beach. There the students enjoyed a lot with sea water and the team visited the Murudeshwar temple. This is one of the famous and oldest temples.

Murudeshwar is a small pilgrimage town on the coast of Karnataka, 160 km north of the Mangalore International Airport. "Murudeshwar" is another name of Lord Shiva. The Murudeshwar beach has two beautiful temples with majestic statues. This small and beautiful town is famous for the world's second-tallest Lord Shiva statue and Murudeshwar Temple that has a 20-storey high Gopura guarded by two life-size concrete elephants at the steps leading inside the temple.

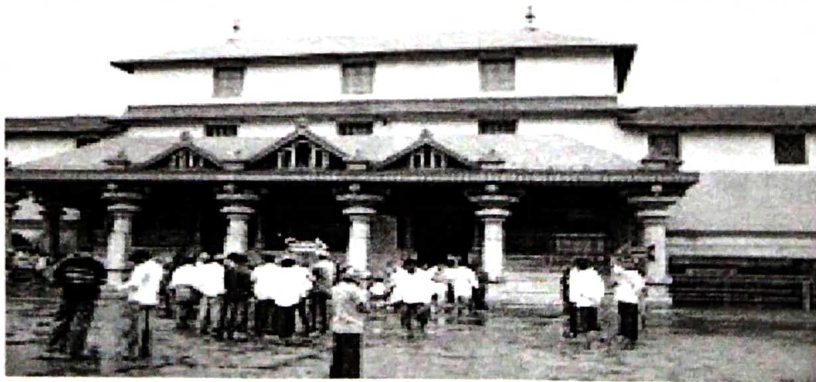

St. Mary's Islands, also known as Coconut Island and Thonsepar, are a set of four small islands in the Arabian Sea of the coast of Malpe. They are known for their distinctive geological formation of columnar basaltic lava. The students were found jumping around with joy amongst this beautiful Mary's island rocks. The Sun-set amongst the island was again a different experience.

Visit to Dharmastal Manjunath temple

Early morning after breakfast the team set out to the Manjunatha Temple which is there in Dharmasthala. Dharmasthala Temple is an 800-year-old religious institution in the temple town of Dharmasthala in Dakshina Kannada. The deities of the temple are Shiva, who is referred to as Mañjunatha, The temple is unusual in that it is run by Jainadministration and poojas are conducted by Hindu priests of Madhva order.

After visiting the manjunath temple our team climbed the Ratnagiri hill to visit the Gomateshwara statue at Dharmasthala.

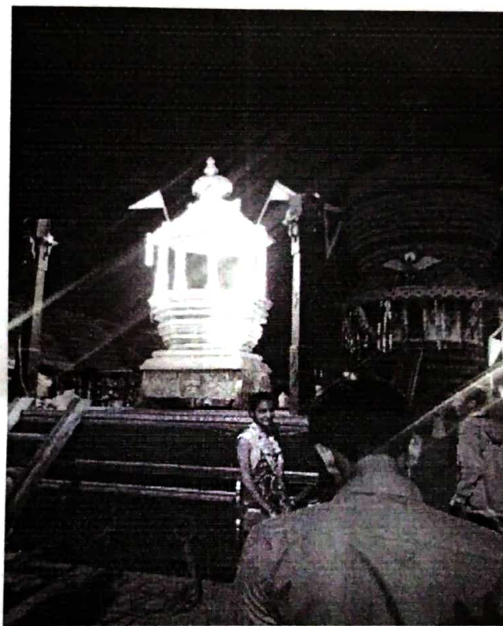
Dharmasthala is famous for Sri Manjunatheshwara Temple and Bahubali monolithic statue of 39 feet height and weighing more than 210 tons. This statue, located on Ratnagiri Betta, was brought to this location from Karkala in 1982. Confluence of various religions is the evidence of the tolerance and spirit of oneness that is the quintessence of Dharmasthala.

Visit to Udapi

After lunch the entire team reached the Udapi. Udapi is notable for the Krishna Temple and lends its name to the popular Udapi cuisine. It is also known as Lord Parasurama Kshetra, and is famous for Kanakana Kindi.

The team reached the Madikeri at 9.00 pm. After the Dinner the entire tem enjoyed singing where they forgot the exhaustion.

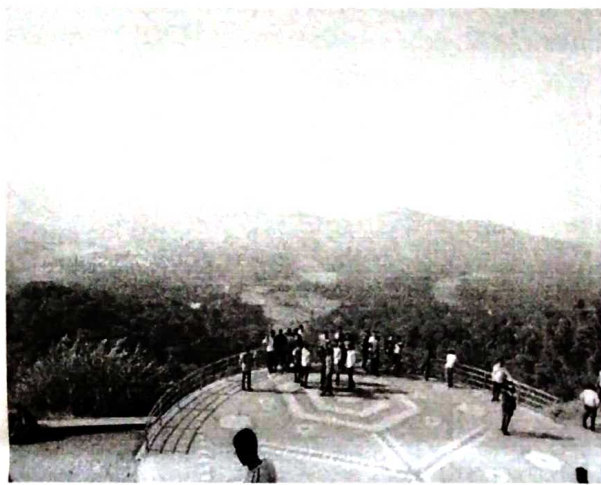
Visit to Madikeri

The beautiful morning from the hotel was feeling which was not expressible. After having breakfast the entire team now set out for the visit of Madikeri city. Madikeri is a hill station town in Karnataka state, India. Also known as *Mercara*, it is the headquarters of the district of Kodagu (also called Coorg). It is a popular tourist destination. Madikeri was formerly known as *Muddu raja keri*. *Muddurajakeri* which means Mudduraja's town was named after the prominent Haleri king, Mudduraja who ruled Kodagu from 1633 to 1687.

Omkareshwar Temple

First it began with the visit to the Omkareshwara temple which was located at the heart of the town, Omkareshwara temple was built by king Lingarajendra in 1820. The temple has both Islamic and Gothic styles of architecture, built around a central pool. It is said Lingarajendra killed an honest and pious Brahmin to fulfill his political ambitions. That Brahmin became a "Brahmarakshasa" and started troubling the king. In order to purify himself for the killing of a Brahmin, he was advised to construct a temple to Lord Shiva. He brought a Shivalinga from Kashi, and the temple was built and named "Omkareshwara".

After visiting the omkareshwara temple the entire team went to rajaseat. This is a small square viewing spot like a mantapa in brick and mortar of four pillars bridged by arches, enhanced by beautiful surroundings. This spot was a favorite place of recreation for the Rajas and hence was permanently associated with them. It is built on a high level ground with a commanding view of the cliffs and valleys to the west. Indeed, the place is great and beautiful.

Talakaveri Visit



In the beautiful evening the faculties with students reached the talakaveri at 5.00 pm. There we climbed the Brahmagiri hill to visit the Talakaveri which is the origin of Kaveri River.

Talakaveri is the place that is generally considered to be the source of the river Kaveri. It is located by Brahmagiri hill near Bhagamandala in Kodagu district, Karnataka, 1,276 m. above sea level. However, there is not a permanent visible flow from this place to the main river course except during the rainy season. The temple here is dedicated to Goddess Kaveriamma.

A tank or *kundike* has been erected on a hillside, at the place that is said to be the origin. It is also marked by a small temple, and the area is frequented by pilgrims. The river originates as a spring feeding this tank, which is considered to be a holy place to bathe on special days. The waters are then said to flow underground to emerge as the Kaveri river some distance away. The temple has been renovated extensively by the state government recently [2007]. After visiting the Bagmandal we went to Mysore did heavy dinner; we returned to our room and relaxed.

Visit to Mysore City

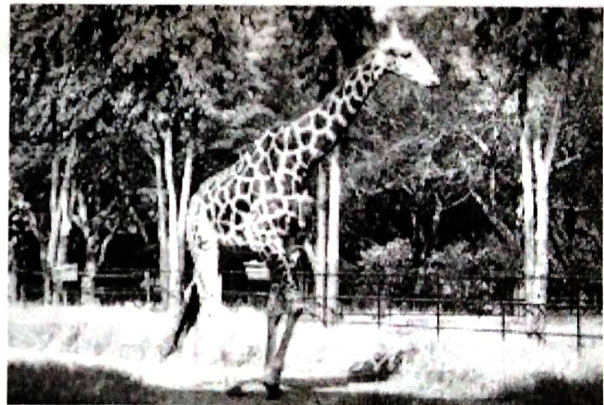
After a hearty breakfast in the morning we started our journey to visit Mysore city. Mysore is the most popular tourist place in Karnataka.

Mysore Zoo

Morning 9.00am we reached the zoo. After taking the entry tickets we entered inside the Zoo. Zoo is Located in the heart of Mysore city, the zoo is a very popular tourist attraction. It's arguably the second sought after attraction in the city after Mysore Palace. There are many reasons for its popularity. The location is an obvious plus point from a itinerary point. More importantly this is a sprawling zoo with a great variety of exotic and rare animals. The animals are let in a natural habitat like environment. For the visitors it is a joyous place to explore in a picnic style.

Mysore zoo is one of the oldest zoos in the country. This was started way back in 1892 as a private zoo attached to the palace. Though it is popularly called "Mysore Zoo", the official name is Shri Chamarajendra Zoological Gardens, named after its founding maharaja Shri Chamarajendra Wodeyar.

Other exotic animals of Mysore zoo include Giraffes, Zebras, White Deer, African Elephants, Bears, Porcupines, Rhinoceros, Tapir, and Otters etc.

Mysore Palace

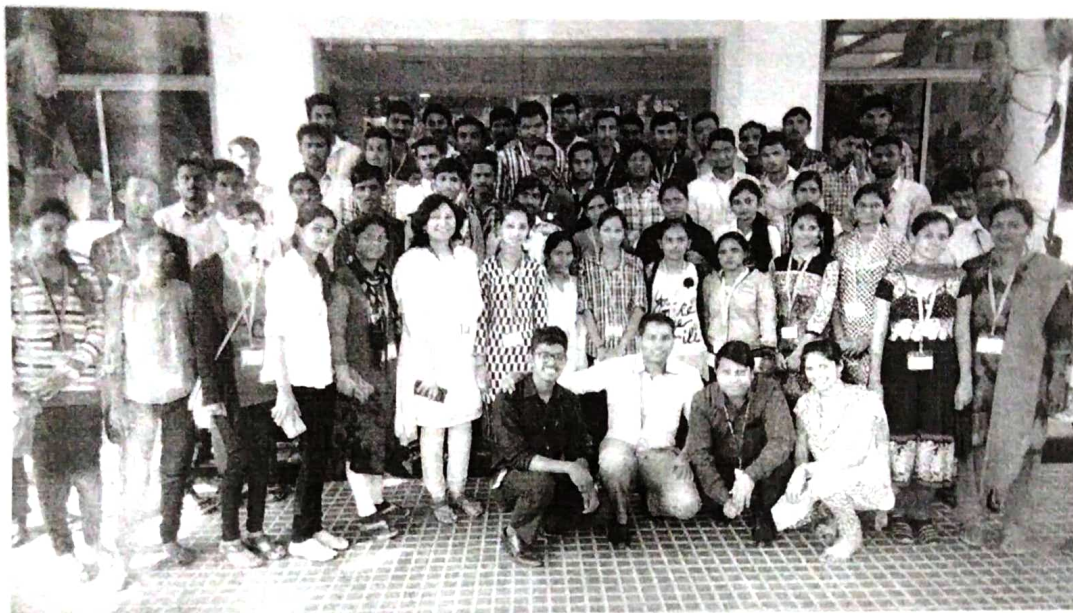




